Dear Law Enforcement Executive:


Since the tragic events of September 11<sup>th</sup>, individuals from my county approach me on a daily basis asking what they can do to assist in the nation's fight against terrorism. To meet this growing need, the Burlington County Prosecutor's Office and the Burlington County Sheriff's Department worked with the Community Anti-Terrorism Institute to pilot the C.A.T. Eyes (Community Anti-Terrorism Training) Program with two groups, comprised of citizens, fire fighters and law enforcement officers. Those who took the course are extremely enthusiastic about the program, and stated that it was very worthwhile and that they would recommend it to others.

The two-hour training session is presented through an engaging power-point format, which succinctly and responsibly teaches the participants about terrorism, the criteria terrorists tend to use to select targets and possible signs of terrorist behavior, with the focus on observable actions rather than on ancestry or national origin. It is a passive program, which citizens can use as part of a Neighborhood Watch organization, or while engaging in their everyday activities. Citizens learn how to enhance their powers of observation, and report the type of information that is relevant to law enforcement. The class also distinguishes between reports requiring use of the emergency 911 system, and those that can be passed on for later reporting.

Because the C.A.T. Institute offers this on a train-the-trainer basis, we have been able to have a number of our officers become instructors, so that we can continue to use the C.A.T. program in our county.

This is an excellent program and an important service to the community that is easy to provide. I urge you to explore the C.A.T. Institute's web site at [www.cateyesprogram.com](http://www.cateyesprogram.com) and to consider implementing this important initiative in your community.
